About the event

A central challenge in the effort to achieve sustainable development concerns how to balance needs for economic development with measures to ensure social and environmental sustainability in the continuum from “source-to-sea”. There are linkages between sustainable management of freshwater systems, sanitation, land use, urban development and climate change with the health of our oceans that points to the importance of coordinating management efforts to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) across sectors and administrative borders.

Objectives

This side event will showcase experiences from industrialized as well as developing regions on the governance and management of resource flows from “source-to-sea”. The ambition is to learn how nations and regional organisations can support the implementation of source-to-sea measures in a broader economic perspective to achieve SDG 14. Recommendations that can be taken onboard by governments, private sector and other actors to reach the SDG 14, implementing a system perspective from source-to-sea at the national and regional levels, will be identified.
